A Message from the Principal

Dear Students, Parents, and Guardians,

As we enter the last two months of the school year, we turn some of our thoughts to next year's priorities. Absences during this time may affect a student's opportunities to demonstrate curriculum expectations and their ability to earn a credit. Families should not plan travel or absences until after students have completed all of their final evaluations. 
